Preparing Maui's students for the future since 1995, MACC and the Department of Education, Maui District, have been members of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts' Partners in Education program, a national network of over 100 performing art centers and school districts. The focus of our partnership is threefold: offering professional development for teachers, providing arts learning for students, and cultivating artists to be leaders and teachers. Over 1,200 classroom teachers have participated in workshops and summer institutes taught by innovative teaching artists that result in lessons that empower Maui students to create, collaborate, and think critically. 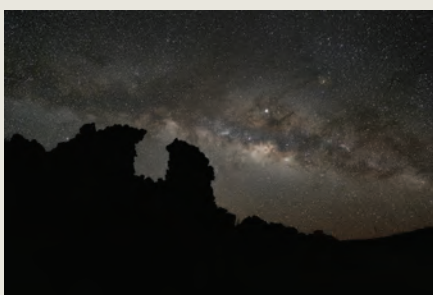

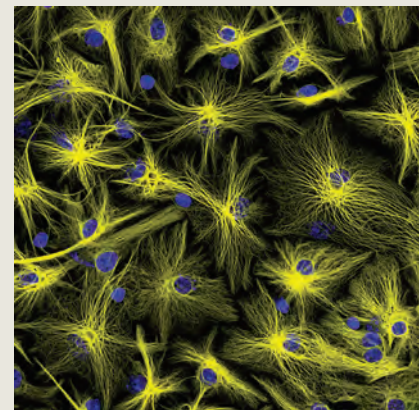


Stan Honda, *Lava, Haleakalā*, 2019, photography

Cellula

October 11 - December 20, 2020
Opening Reception October 10

Canadian artist **Radha Chaddah** makes art about invisible realities in the cellular world using light as her primary medium. Her combined background in film and molecular neurobiology inspired her to combine art and research in stem cell biology to create *Cellula*. This multimedia installation will include images of various plant and animal cells with microscopic views ten to one million times life size. Video projections and spatial modules will lead visitors through a garden of reflected moving light for a total immersive experience.

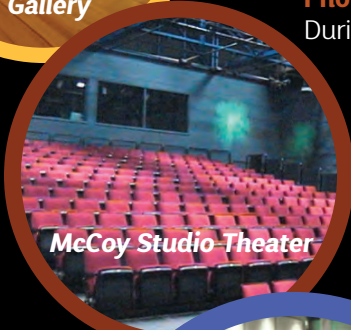
